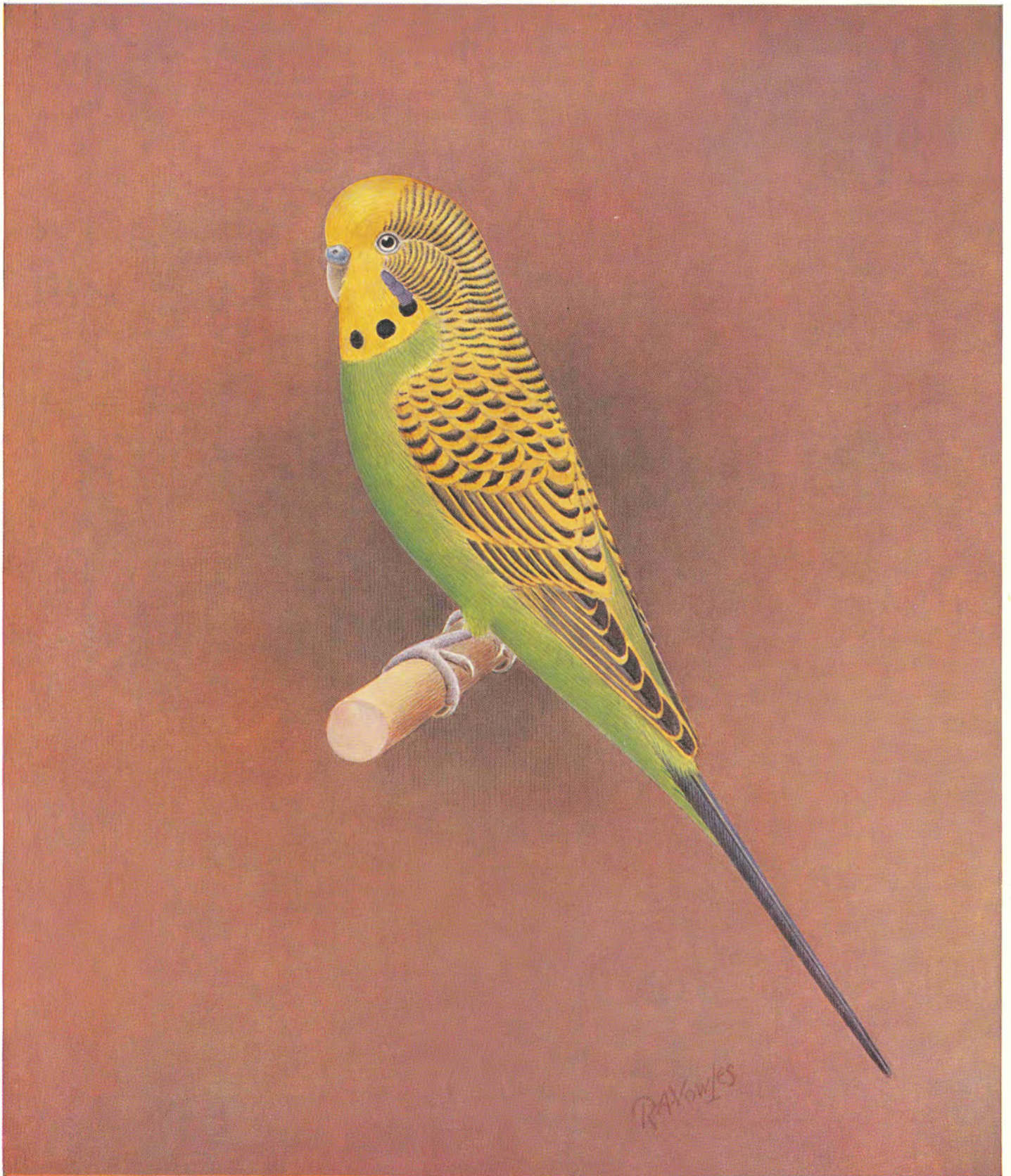

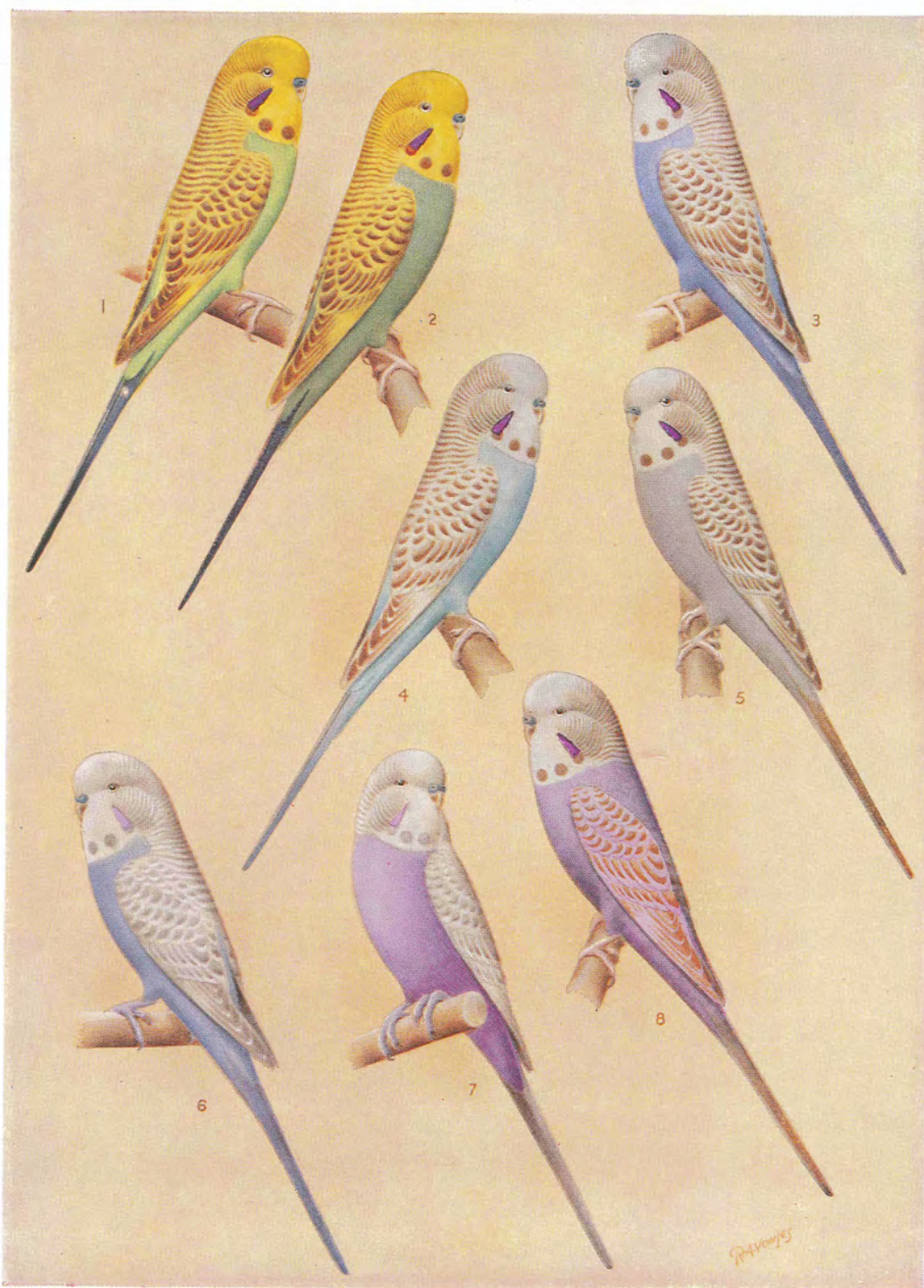

BUDGERIGARS (*Melopsittacus undulatus*)

Family of Light Yellows, the cock being of "yellow" feather quality and the hen a "buff" with paler colour and less wing lacing. After moulting, the two young birds of bleached "mealy" colour will be pure in plumage without any sign of lacing.

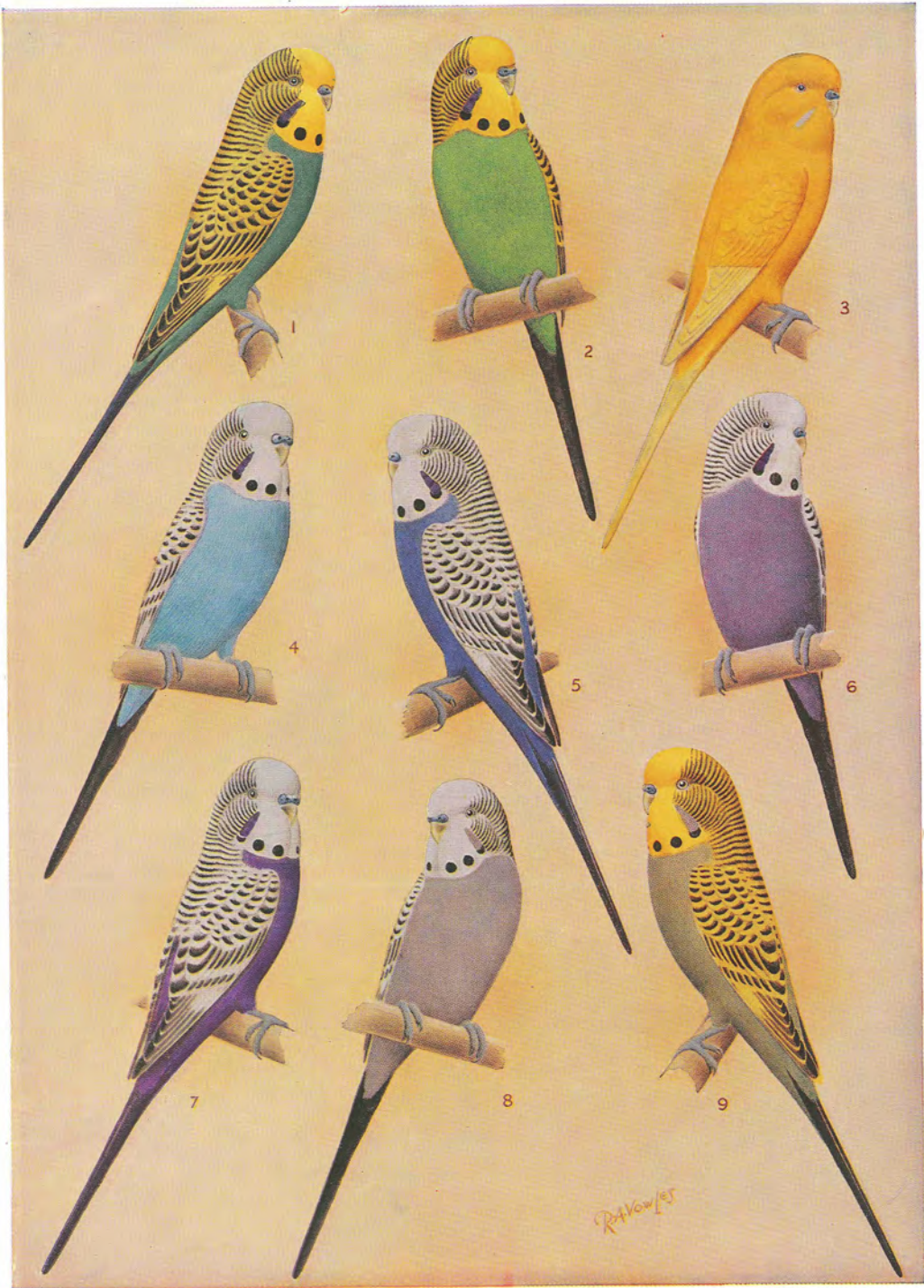
